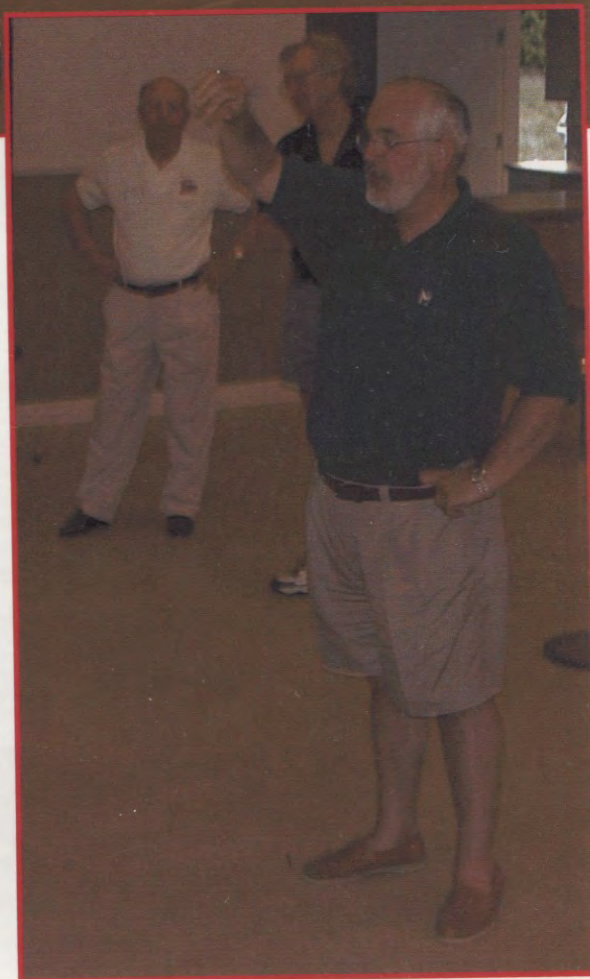
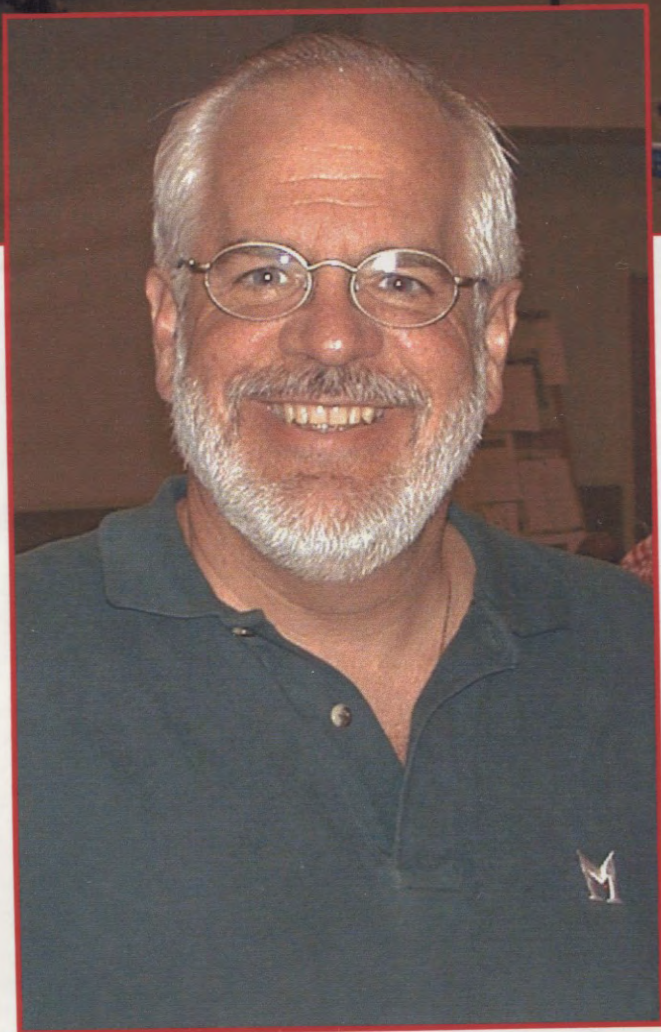
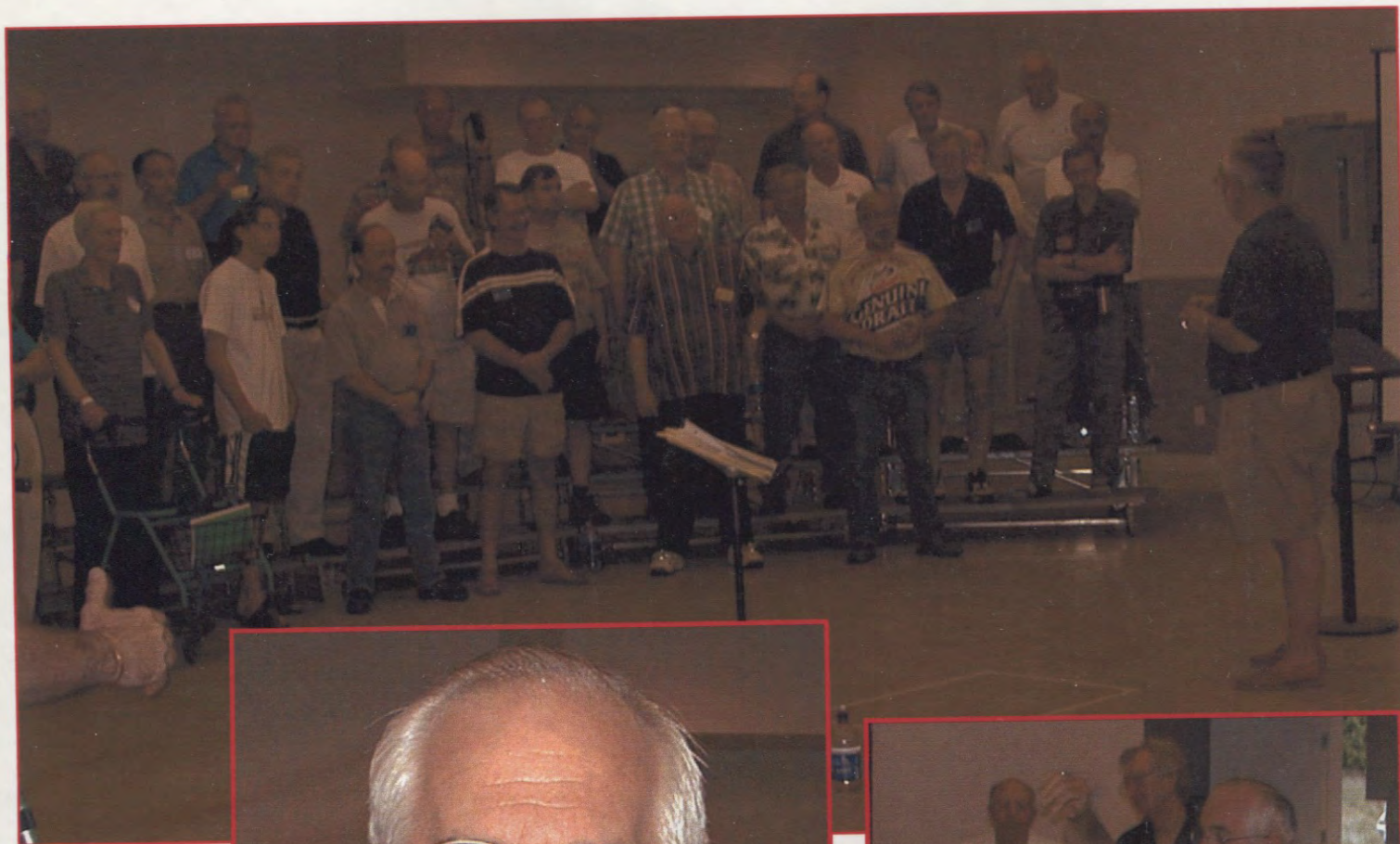
I had a great time in Canada, thanks in no small way to the welcome I received from all the Members of the First Capital Chorus.
